#### Jaime Morse

Jaime is Otipemisiwak/Nehiyaw (Métis/Cree) from Lac La Biche in northern Alberta and Buffalo Lake Métis Settlement. She is recognized as an international award-winning dancer across the Métis homelands having won the Emerging Aboriginal Artist Award from the Ontario Arts Council for her work in visual arts as well as dance. Jaime comes from a talented family including her Grandmother (Nanoosh), who was a well-loved dancer, mother, musician and Fisher Woman, who at the age of 35, was murdered. Through Jaime's company Indigenous Walks, participants learn about the social, political and cultural issues from an Indigenous perspective, especially that of Missing

and Murdered Indigenous Women. The goal of Indigenous Walks is to provide the public with awareness of who Indigenous people are in a safe, interesting and caring environment.
