Learn to sketch Sea Creatures with Heather Campbell. Heather will talk about the importance of these sea creatures to Inuit culture. You'll learn to draw a whale, seal, walrus and polar bear. This is an opportunity to be taught sketching techniques and skills for the beginner and experienced skechers.



Heather Campbell is originally from Rigolet, Nunatsiavut, NL and holds a BFA from Memorial University of Newfoundland. Campbell was Curatorial Assistant at the Inuit Art Centre, Ottawa, ON for a number of years, and was on the board of directors of Gallery 101 artist run centre as well as the board of the Artist Run Centres and Collectives of Ontario. Currently she is the Strategic Initiatives Director at the Inuit Art Foundation. Campbell's art has been in a number of group exhibitions, most recently the touring group exhibition *Nunatsiavut - Our Beautiful Land* at le guilde in Montreal, QC.




Supply list
